## Oil Man Is Praised as Enemy of 'Bolshevism and Pan-Jewry'

Wireless to THE NEW YORK TIMES. ROSTOCK, Mecklenburg, Feb. 10. -Sir Henri Deterding, former head of the Royal Dutch Petroleum Company, was buried on his estate near here today. After a short service for members of the immediate family, a large official funeral ceremony was held, at which were present business leaders from all parts of Europe as well as representatives of The Netherlands and German

Sir Henri was credited oration of Bishop Schultz of Schwerin with having fought bol-shevism with the "boldness of a Napoleon and the will power of a Cromwell" and described as one who having opposed the "injustice of Versailles," saw in its reparation the salvation of the world from "pan-Jewry and bolshevism."
